WHAT IS TRANSITION? A GATEWAY TO SERVICES FOR YOUNG ADULTS

Transition means coordinating your activities that promote movement from high school to post-school activities, including post-secondary education, vocational training, integrated employment (including supported employment), adult services, independent living, or community participation. This coordination shall be based on your needs, strengths, preferences, and interests.

The ADRC can assist with connecting you with adult services and supports while you are still involved in school transition activities.

WHEN DO I ASK ADRC FOR HELP?

At 17 years 6 months, we can meet with you and your family to begin the formal process to connect you with the resources to transition into adult life as you turn 18.

We often meet with families any time after 14 years old, either at a school meeting or a home visit. At this time, we begin to share different resources available as supports change when you turn 18.

What is an Evidence Based Program?

These are **CLASSES** that have been shown repeatedly to have great success in improving health and wellness. For more information about any of these classes, **contact ADRC of Dodge County at (920) 386-3580 or toll free at (800) 924-6407.**

Living Well With Chronic Conditions and Living Well With Chronic Pain Classes

2.5 hour class once a week for 6 weeks

- For adults with chronic health conditions such as heart disease, lung problems, multiple sclerosis, arthritis, chronic pain.
Research shows participants:
 - Enjoy improved health
 - Have fewer doctor visits
 - Have fewer hospitalizations

Healthy Living With Diabetes Class

2.5 hour class once a week for 6 weeks

- For adults with Type 2 diabetes or pre-diabetes
Research shows participants:
 - Report improved health
 - Show improved blood sugar levels
 - Have fewer doctor & emergency room visits
 - Have fewer hospitalizations

Stepping On Falls Prevention Class

2.5 hour class once a week for 7 weeks

- For adults who have fallen, are at risk of falling or who have fear of falling
Research shows participants:
 - Are more confident in their ability to do the activities that are necessary to be independent
 - Understand how to reduce their risks
 - Reduce falls

Mind Over Matter (MOM)

2 hour class every other week for 1 month

- MOM is a workshop that helps older women build skills and confidence to adopt exercises and adjust diet to improve symptoms

Powerful Tools for Caregivers

2.5 hour class once a week for 6 weeks

- Focuses on conditions of the caregiver to help with the physical, emotional, and financial challenges of being a caregiver.

What Do You Need to Enroll?

1. Social Security Numbers (or document numbers for legal immigrants).
2. Employer and income information for every member of your household who needs coverage (pay stub or W-2, etc).
3. Policy numbers for current health insurance plans covering.
4. If anyone in your household is eligible for a job-based insurance plan, you will need to have their employer complete an Employer Coverage Tool (available on the healthcare.gov website).

You May Qualify for Lower Premiums or Out-of-Pocket Costs, Based on Your Household Income and Size.

2019 Health Care Marketplace: An individual making up to about \$49,960 or a family of 4 making up to about \$103,000 may qualify for these lower costs.

There will be penalties if you don't enroll in a health plan.

Elder and Adults At Risk

What is an Elder at Risk?

When a person 60 years and older is subjected to physical abuse, material or financial exploitation, neglect, self neglect or emotional abuse.

What is an Adult at Risk?

When a person 18 or 59 years old who has a physical, mental illness or developmental disability that substantially impairs their ability to care for their needs and is experiencing physical abuse, material or financial exploitation, neglect, self neglect or emotional abuse.

Examples of Abuse:

- **Physical Abuse** is the willful infliction of physical pain, injury or unreasonable confinement. It includes, but is not limited to, beating, choking, burning, inappropriate medication, tying, locking a person up and sexual assault.
- **Material or Financial Exploitation** is the misuse of money or property. It includes deception, diverting income, mismanagement of funds and taking money or possessions against a person's will.
- **Neglect** occurs when a caregiver's failure to provide adequate food, shelter, clothing, supervision, medical or dental care results in significant danger to the physical or mental health of an elder or adult under their care.
- **Self-Neglect** occurs when an elder or adult's physical or mental health is endangered by their own inability to provide adequate food, shelter, clothing, medical or dental care.
- **Emotional Abuse** is name calling, threatening, harassing or treating an elder or adult like a child. It also includes isolating an elder or adult from their family members and friends.

Risk Factors for Elders and Adults at Risk:

- Significant losses in life which result in their becoming more dependent (e.g. death of spouse, loss of health, loss of independence, etc.)
- History of family conflict and poor family relationships
- Unreasonable expectations placed on elder or adult by caregiver and vice versa
- Substance abuse by caregiver, elder and/or adult
- Caregiver dependence on an elder or adult for money and/or support
- Poor physical and/or mental health of caregiver
- Caregiver attempts to assume power of attorney when the elder or adult is not capable of understanding what they are signing
- Caregiver overburdened by caring for other dependents, having too many demands and having poor impulse control or conflict resolution skills
- An elder or adult who is at risk for exploitation due to cognitive impairments.

Advance Directives

Advance planning allows you to make choices regarding your medical care and/or finances in the event that you become incapacitated. This is your opportunity to express your wishes rather than potentially having a court appoint a guardian to do this for you. Advance planning may be made by any competent individual 18 years and older.

The Wisconsin Department of Health Services has advance directive forms available online. These forms are designed to be completed without the assistance of an attorney. Given your particular circumstances or concerns, you may want to seek legal advice from an attorney.

To be valid, the forms must be complete and signed. The Declaration to Physicians (Living Will) and the Power of Attorney for Health Care have accompanying letters that are not part of the legal forms but contain information that should be read prior to completing the forms.

The forms contain standardized wording specified in the Wisconsin Statutes. If these forms are filled out and signed correctly, the completed forms are presumed to be valid in the State of Wisconsin.

An adult-at-risk is a person age 18-59 and is diagnosed with intellectual disabilities, physical disabilities, brain injury, mental health, or alcohol and drug abuse issues. Everyone has the right to live in an environment in which they feel safe. This is especially true for those individuals who are more vulnerable, such as those with physical or intellectual disabilities, mental illness, or the elderly.

Adult Day Centers can give caregivers respite by providing a center where their loved ones can be taken for a couple of hours or the entire day and picked back up later. Adult Day Centers are one of the best options for adult caregivers who are in need of regular respite care in order to return to the workforce, relax, see to errands, appointments, and other responsibilities. Adult day services provide services generally Monday through Friday in a group setting to adults who need assistance with the activities of daily living and supervision. Participants in adult daycare may receive assistance with personal cares, supervision, meals, medication administration, and may participate in various social activities and community outings. - May outside services come in to help me?
- What is the ratio of staff to residents?
- What are the policies regarding visitors?
- Is there an emergency response system & backup?
- Is there transportation available? What is the cost?
- Is there parking or garage for a vehicle?
- If I'm hospitalized, what happens to my apartment?
- What personal possessions may I bring?
- Has the facility had any citations?
- What happens when my money runs out?

Housing Definitions

Residential Care Apartment Complex (RCAC)

- Apartment-type units with their own kitchen, bathroom, living and sleeping areas.
- Residents are somewhat independent, usually needing some degree of help with daily living activities. Through the facility, a resident can obtain up to 28 hours of assistance per week. Emergency assistance is available.
- Social and recreational activities, as well as meals available. Ask what services are included in the monthly rate and what services require additional payment.
- RCAC facilities that are registered with the state accept private pay only.
- If the facility is certified with the state, they may be able to accept funding if it is available and the resident is eligible. The RCAC manager can answer financial questions.

Community Based Residential Facility (CBRF)

- Group home setting consisting of 5-21+ beds. Can be single or double occupancy rooms, usually with a halfbath.
- Common dining and living areas.
- Facilities are licensed by the state and classified according to size and the population served.
- Required to provide assistance with bathing, dressing, grooming, medications, referral services.
- Many facilities offer additional service packages for increased rates.
- Scheduled in-home and community activities, transportation for errands, etc.
- Payment for these facilities are generally private pay. Long-term support funding is available to help with costs. The CBRF manager can answer questions regarding financial matters.

(Housing Definitions, continued)

Independent Living Apartment

- Multi-unit dwellings specifically for older and/or disabled residents capable of managing their own lives.
- Costs range from subsidized apartments for low income individuals to expensive condominium style units.
- Some complexes may have recreation rooms, activities, transportation services and/or a mealsite.
- These facilities have minimal health services.
- Some may charge entrance fees.

Skilled Nursing Facility (Nursing Home)

- Health care facility that provides nursing services 24 hours a day.
- Persons needing extensive supervision, those with complex health plans, residents needing rehabilitative services (occupational, physical or speech therapy) or those who do not have supportive living services available are residents who would benefit from nursing home care.
- Costs vary according to the services and the level of care provided.
- The daily rate should include room and board, activities, social services and nursing care.

- Therapy, medications, dental care, foot care and personal items are typically not included in the daily rate.
- Nursing homes have admission agreements that include information about the daily rate, policies regarding transfers and discharges, policies regarding the handling of residents funds and the rights and responsibilities of the residents.
- Nursing homes are licensed and surveyed by state and federal regulators.
- There are a variety of ways to pay for nursing home costs:
- Medicare pays for limited nursing home stays as long as it meets their requirements.
- Long-term care or supplemental insurance may pay for some stays.
- Medical Assistance may cover unlimited stays once financial criteria is met.
- Private pay or veterans benefits may also be used.

The nursing home administrator and/or social worker can answer questions regarding financial matters.
