Effective January 1st, 1981, the Dodge County Police Department merged with the Sheriff's Department to form the Dodge County Sheriff's Department. For 56 years they had been a separate entity of Dodge County Law Enforcement, known as the Dodge County Motor Police.

The Dodge County Motor Police was organized in 1924 with a two-man force. They patrolled the highways on motorcycles, and were hired during the summer months only, from April 15th to November 15th. The purpose for this patrol was to enforce motor vehicle regulations. The officers were deputized to assist the Sheriff's department also.

In 1929, the officers worked 12 months out of the year, using their private cars during inclement weather. They patrolled from 9:00 a.m. until 9:00 p.m., and were subject to call at other hours.

After 1936, the County Police discontinued using motorcycles due to the accidental deaths of three officers (Lisko - Theisen - Bentz).

In 1938, the County Police equipped their cars with radios. Prior to the radios, officers would call in by telephone to get assignments and to find out if any accident had occurred.

In 1949, officers started patrolling 24 hours per day. This was also the start of County-owned squad cars.

The department grew from two officers, one small room for radio dispatchers and one room for traffic officers to a new building in 1959, then to the Sheriff's living quarters that had been renovated. Between 1976 and 1977, the Traffic Department moved to the ground floor of the Courthouse while the 1890 jail building was torn down and the present Law Enforcement and Detention Center was being built.

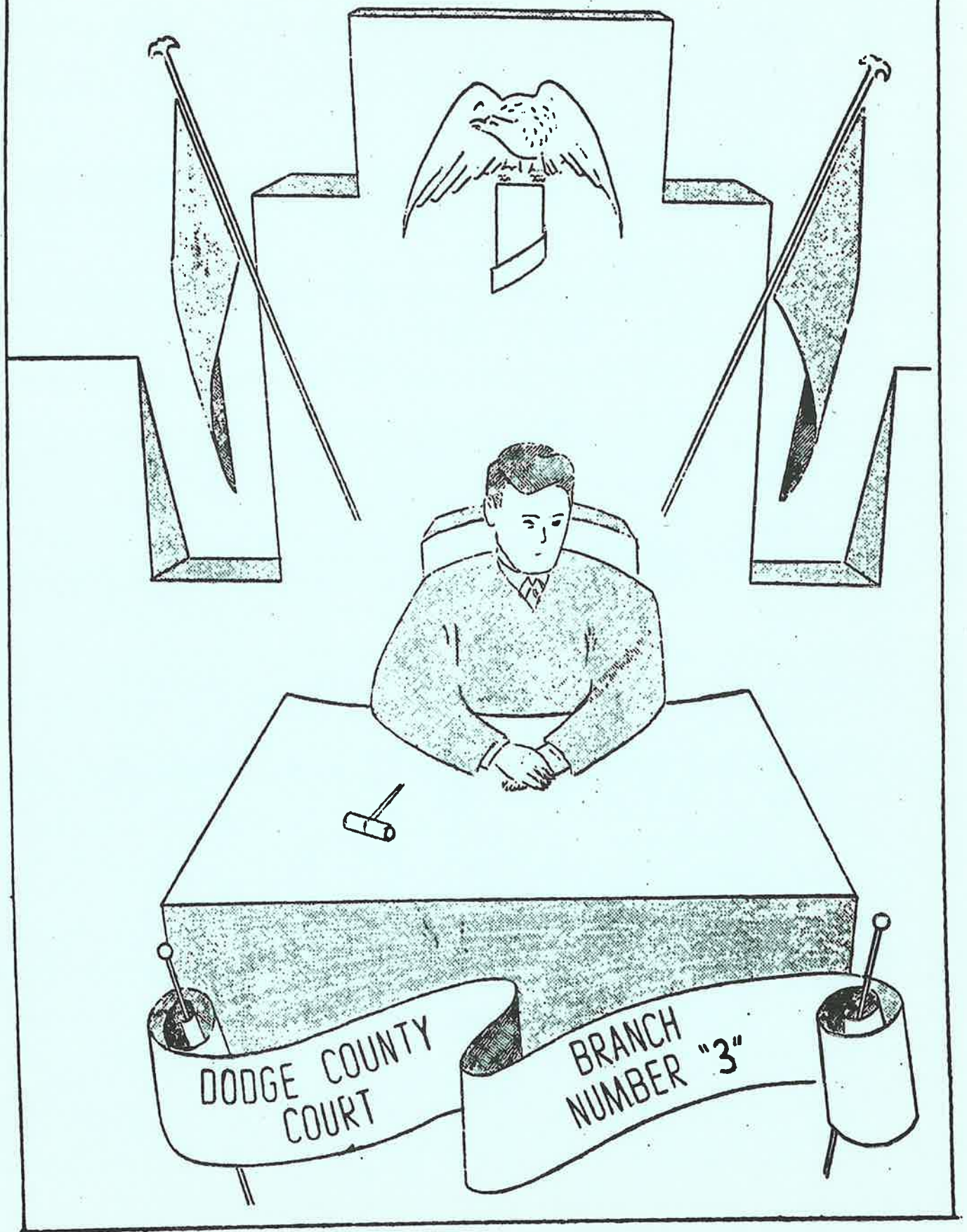

FINES & COURT COSTS: A total of \$134,685.35 was assessed to the above violators. In 1979 a total of \$115,863.09 was assessed.

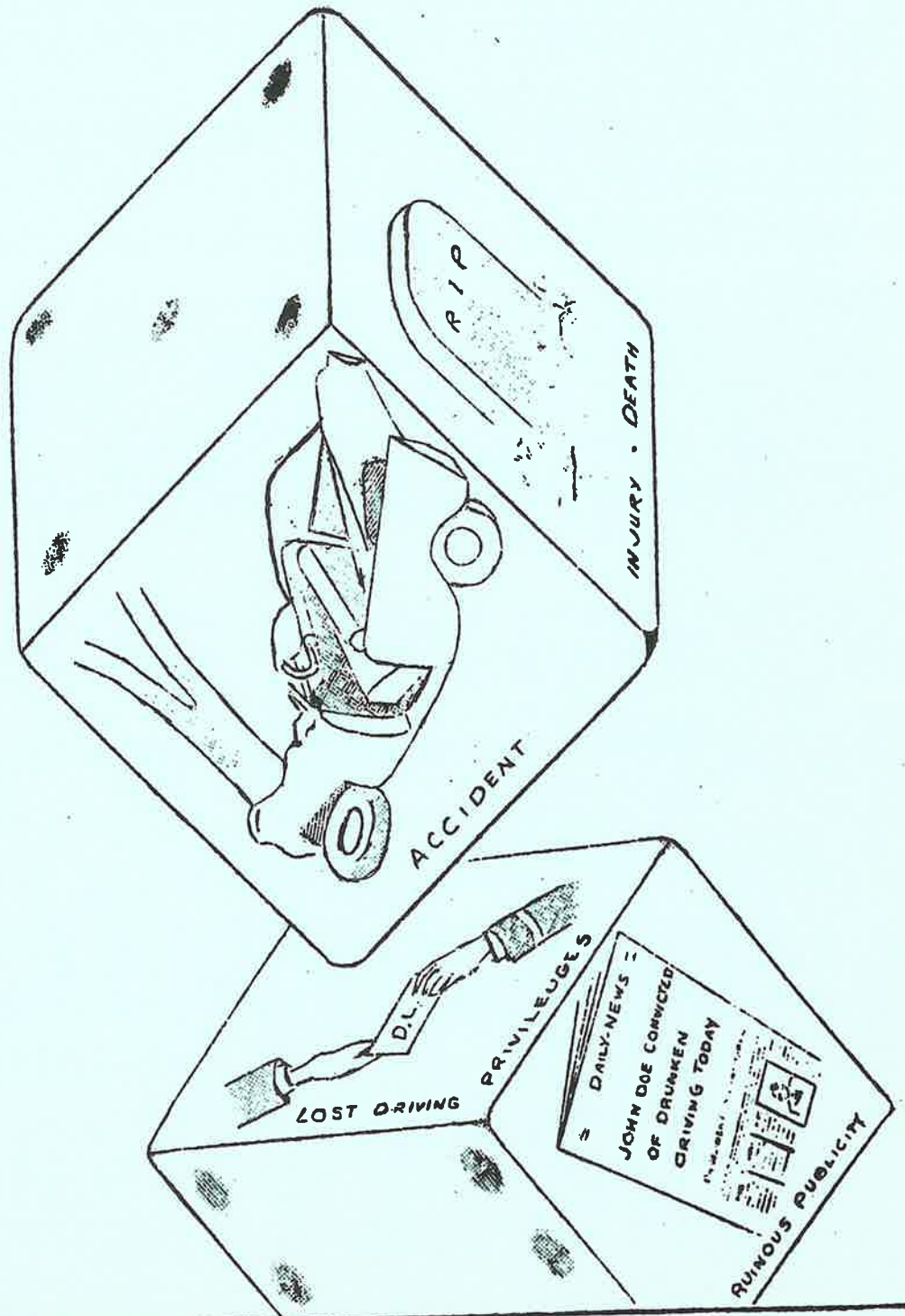
