MEDICAL ASSISTANCE (TITLE 19, MA, MEDICAID): §867.02, Wis. Stats. Requires that you notify the Department of Health and Family Services if the deceased or the deceased's spouse received Medical Assistance or any of the other service or benefits that are listed on the Petition. Mail the **Probate Claims Notice** or a copy of the Petition and Notice to Creditors by certified mail, return receipt requested, to: Department of Health and Family Services, Estate Recovery Program, P.O. A bond may be required before Letters are issued. This would be decided by the Court based on the value of the estate, the type of assets and the terms on the will.

**CERTIFIED COPIES:** If certified copies are required, the cost is \$3.00 for the certification plus \$1.00 per page to be certified. (A certified copy of a one-page document is \$4.00; a certified copy of a two-page document is \$5.00, etc.)
