The Dodge County Sheriff's Office is proud to announce a collaborative public awareness campaign with the Love, Logan Foundation to educate the community about the dangers of fentanyl and counterfeit pills. Vehicle graphics featuring a "One Pill Can Kill" message can be seen on the Dodge County Sheriff's Office vehicle driven by Lomira School District School Resource Officer Jay Thielmann. The intent of these eye-catching graphics is to be seen throughout the community, helping to spread this critical message. The Love, Logan Foundation, a nationally recognized 501(c)(3) non-profit organization, was founded by Erin and Rick Rachwal from Pewaukee, WI, in memory of their son, Logan, who tragically lost his life to fentanyl poisoning on Valentine's Day, 2021. The Love, Logan Foundation is dedicated to saving lives through educational and awareness initiatives in schools and the community, especially related to fentanyl and counterfeit pills.
